

Fun Halloween projects : Spider



WHAT YOU NEED:

MBRT4001 MONT MARTE FACE N BODY WEDGES 4 PCG
BMHS0041 MONT MARTE GALLERY SERIES BRUSH SET 4 PCG

1. Creating the outline. Refer to the image page of this PDF and transfer the outline onto the arm with the finest brush in the gallery series brush kit. Use Black paint. Start with the body and paint it in. Remember to leave a space for the Red spot and take the round shape and light source in to consideration and shade the body accordingly. Once the body is done, add the legs. Remember the legs are a tubular shape and they will be in shadow where the light does not hit them.

When painting the skin with face n body paint, to suggest lighter tones, it is best to lay down the colour and then remove the tone with a damp brush. This is a good way to add highlights as well. You can also blend colours into one another directly on the skin, just ensure the mix of paint is not overly wet.

2. Adding the Red spot. Paint the open area of the spot in with the Red paint and while it is still a little damp, add some Bright Red into the top portion of the circle and blend it in so there is a smooth transition.



3. Adding the shadow. This effect will make the spider look very three dimensional. Again, take the light source into account and think where the shadow would be cast. Use the Black to do this and ensure the paint is fairly watered down so it is quite Grey. Ensure the cast shadow attaches to each leg and falls in the right direction.



4. Highlights. To add interest and realism you can add highlights on the legs. Use White for this and do it on the joints of the legs and the head. Use this sparingly and ensure the paint does not become contaminated with the underlying Black paint.

Face n Body paint can be easily removed with warm soapy water and a face washer or with makeup remover wipes.
